

## **Promises, Promises**

### **God's Promises**

**Genesis 12:1-3** God's promise to Abraham

**Exodus 19:3-8** God's proposal to the Children of Israel and their response.

**Deuteronomy 30:15-20** God's response to the behavior of the Children of Israel.

**II Samuel 7:10-16** God establishing the Davidic/Messianic dynasty.

**Isaiah 9:5(6)-6(7)** A child is born.

**Luke 2:8-14** Messiah is born in the town of David.

### **People's Promises**

**Genesis 24:1-4** Abraham making his servant promise to bring a bride for Isaac only from Haran.

**Genesis 24:58-67** Rebecca becomes the wife of Isaac.

**Genesis 47:28-31** Joseph promises to have Jacob buried in Israel.

**Genesis 50:12-14** Jacob is buried in the cave of Machpelah in Hebron.

**Genesis 50:24-26** Joseph makes his brothers promise to (eventually) bury him in Israel.

**Exodus 13:17-19** Moses takes Joseph's bones out of Egypt.

**Joshua 24:32** Joseph's bones are buried in Shechem.

**Ruth 1:16-17** Your God will be my God.

**Ruth 4:13-17** Ruth marries Boaz and gives birth to the grandfather of David.

**Matthew 26:30-35** Peter and the disciples promise to never turn away from Yeshua.

**Matthew 5:33-37** Should Peter have listened to these words?

**Matthew 26:69-75** Peter denies Yeshua three times.

**John 21:15-19** Peter "returns" to Yeshua.

Does this mean it's possible to break a promise to Yeshua and still come back to him?

**Matthew 26:6-13** The woman with the alabaster jar.

**Luke 7:36-50** Is this the same woman?

What is the significance of the woman with the alabaster jar?

If she wasn't rich, why was she carrying around perfume worth (by today's standards) tens of thousands of dollars?

Why don't we tell her story as Yeshua wanted?
